String me along



Objective:

Engage with the team in a group challenge to scribble Royal Albatross or draw a Tall Ship on a white sheet.

Goal:

The challenge kicks in when you will be required to complete the challenge using strands of strings provided and that to co-ordinate the movement of the pen with your team mates to achieve the designated results.

Tug of war



Objective:

To pull rope over marker.

Goal:

This is not just a test of strength but team effort. By collectively focusing on the same objective, they harness the power of alignment. Alignment is the winning factor. Teams whose members pulled together at the same achieved cumulative force wins the game.

Learn the ropes



Objective:

Focused Awareness (Attention training).

Goal:

There are many types of knots used by sailors. Each serves a purpose and knowing how to tie a selection is crucial knowledge to possess when sailing. Ropes and knots aboard ship have a unique and ancient history and without them sailing would not be possible.

Raise the sail



Objective:

Participants will rotate between the different roles of the sailing crew to handle the lines and sails. Teams must work in unison throughout the sail-handling in this activity.

Goal:

This activity will allow team members to understand each other's strengths and weaknesses and will encourage them to work through it towards a common goal. The crew will continue to monitor the safety of the participants as they engage in this activity.

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FAQs

What is the suitable age range for the Edusail programme?

The Royal Albatross offers a variety of fun and engaging nautical activities designed for different age groups, starting from 7 years old and above.

Speak with our Sales Team to find out which activities would be the most suitable and enriching for your students!

Do accompanying educators / adult get to go on board for free?

A 5:1 ratio applies for pre-school and primary levels, and a 10:1 ratio applies for secondary, junior college, and tertiary levels..

For every group of 5 or 10 paying students (depending on level), one accompanying adult can join the programme for free.

This offer is valid when the school meets the minimum group size required.

Is there a minimum pax for each programme?

The minimum group size is 20 students.

If the school does not meet the minimum number, the programme can still proceed.

However, the school will be required to pay for the minimum of 15 participants, even if the actual number of students is lower.

What happens if it rains during a programme?

We operate rain or shine, and the Albatross Speedboat will depart on time unless weather conditions are deemed unsafe for sailing.

In the event of rain, our crew will deploy awnings to cover the Upper Deck of the Royal Albatross and the side screen of the Albatross Speedboats, ensuring guests remain comfortable and dry throughout the experience.

What documents are required by students accompanying educators to bring on board for verification?

A valid Student Pass or Singapore government issued NRIC.

Why do everyone need to remove their shoes onboard the Royal Albatross?

As is customary for all yachts, shoes need to be removed before boarding. The reason is both for safety and to protect the decking and carpeting.

What are the safe management measures in place to minimise the intermingling between students of different schools?

No two schools will be on board the ship at the same time. We will only be running 1 Edusail session at any given point.

What is the Royal Albatross facilitator to student ratio?

There will be one facilitator to every 5 (primary) or 10 (secondary & tertiary) participants.
